

# THE COVER

Jerry Tresser began learning the lettering arts in the mid 70s and had the wonderful opportunity to study with Hermann Zapf (master class) at Rochester University, Emre Schwemmel a very fine typographer, and Sheila Waters an SSI craft member from England (1982). Through those classes he learned how to make a quill, ink, and decipher the historical script.

Jerry has had many opportunities to teach at several of the international calligraphy conventions, national workshops through calligraphic guilds, and teaches locally. His interest and teaching have been in the preparation of Gesso and the application of Gold developed in the 14th century exclusively for



manuscript illumination and on broad edge pen and the historical scripts.


Well known in the calligraphy world, he has had a variety of calligraphic gilded pieces in publication. Including, the SpeedBall Text Book (Neuland alphabet), The Calligrapher's Engagement Calendar, International Calligraphy Today, and was offered a one man show at the World Trade Center in New Orleans.

He is author of the Technique of Raised Gilding, 1992, Michelle Jordan Publication, presently out of print but available on CD; and has written at least a dozen articles. One of those was recently published in "Bound & Lettered" and two articles published through the Society of

Gilders, all relating to Gesso and the methods employed for application to get the shine that can only be obtained from the unique formula which has adorned the manuscripts for several hundred years.

Jerry has been a member of the South Florida Calligraphy Guild for 25 years and has previously served as the President and Worskshop Chairman of the Guild.















# The Handwritten Note
